MAP and DTI's Shared Vision: Push for Change to Promote a Better Future for All

- Sustain economic recovery and growth, attract foreign and domestic investors, improve ease of doing business, create more high-quality jobs
- Embrace innovation and pursue digitalization using strategies driven by science, technology, and innovation (STI)
- Grow our economy and develop globally competitive and innovative industries that support inclusive growth and quality of life for all Filipinos.
- Leverage the power of partnerships and collaborations in developing and implementing our projects and programs



Priority 1. Upgrade, Upskill, and Upsize Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs)

- Science, technology, and innovation (STI) in collaboration with DOST & NEDA
 - Enable MSMEs to respond to changing market demands for quality and new products, processes, & business models
 - Enable MSMEs to make products more affordable to consumers & more competitive in the domestic & global markets
- Graduation from micro to small, small to medium, medium to large



Priority 2. Foster Industries Geared to Domestic Demand

- Promote and support enterprises to take advantage of the Philippines' sizable population and consumer market
- Enterprises to build a solid domestic market base which can support eventual forays into the export market
- Develop agri-based manufacturing industries to empower local farmers and generate more rural-based employment opportunities
- Support digital transformation and innovation in industries through the establishment of Artificial Intelligence R&D Center and Industry 4.0 Pilot Factory
- Implement programs to build a start-up ecosystem



Priority 3. Promote and Support Regional Development

- Broaden the "One Town, One Product" (OTOP) into a regional scope based on the region's natural endowments and comparative advantage
 - Partner with Philippine-American Academy of Science & Engineering (PAASE) and National Academy of Science and Technology (NAST) in innovating OTOP
- **DTI regional offices** to work with their respective regional development councils to promote each region's productivity and competitiveness
- Collaborate with CHED and DOST in strengthening a selected state university in each region to serve as the knowledge hub in the region – doing R&D work for enterprises, training of entrepreneurs and enterprise employees, etc.
- NOTE: Ideally, the SUCs in a region should be clustered or amalgamated to form a regional university to serve as Regional Inclusive Innovation Center

Priority 4. Ensure the Availability of Accessible and Affordable Food

- Collaborate with the **Department of Agriculture** to improve food value chains through upgraded transport and logistics facilities
- Improve cold storage and cold chain facilities
- Streamline Agri-Supply chains to link producers more directly to the markets and possibly eliminate rent-seeking middlemen through technology-led systems
- Transform the agriculture and agribusiness sectors through the adoption of new technologies and innovation



Priority 5. Reconfigure PH Export Sectors into Industry Clusters

- Prioritize the three industry clusters that offer strategic advantages to PH:
 - Industrial, Manufacturing, and Transport (IMT)
 - Technology, Media and Telecommunication (TMT)
 - Health and Life Science (HLS)
- **IMT:** aerospace (aircraft interiors; maintenance, repair, and overhaul) automotive (electric vehicles), and semiconductors
- TMT: digitalization services, BPO sector, AI, analytics, cybersecurity, hyperscalers, creative industries
- HLS: biopharmaceuticals, pharmaceuticals, medical devices, and healthcare services
- Promote ore processing of green metals (NI, Co, Cu) before exporting them



Priority 6. Enable Jobs-Skills Matching and Skills Upgrading

- Collaborate closely DepEd, CHED, and TESDA to ensure matching of skills development of students with the job requirements of industries
- Collaborate closely DepEd, CHED, and TESDA in the adoption of the Philippine Skills Framework for job matching
- Prioritize the manufacturing, construction, logistics and supply chain, health and wellness, food and agriculture, creatives, tourism, and IT-BPM sectors



Priority 7. Improve the Ease of Doing Business

- Reduce regulatory burdens through streamlining and digitalization of institutional and regulatory requirements
- Expand EODB Act in coordination with **DICT** by increasing investment in digital infrastructure
- Support e-government initiatives of DICT and DILG especially in the digitalization of LGU services relevant to business operations
- Foster investment and competition in logistics and connectivity services
- Collaborate with DPWH, DOTR, and DICT to fill the country's infrastructure gaps, especially in physical and digital connectivity



Priority 8. Create an Enabling Environment for Attracting Investments and Expanding Exports

- Push for immediate ratification of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (RCEP) and other free trade agreements (FTAs)
- These agreements will diversify the country's exports in terms of products and services and country destinations, and enhance the country's attractiveness to foreign investments
- Without RCEP and other FTAs, the country will not be an attractive location for such types of export-oriented enterprises
- The Philippines, with only 10 FTAs, has one of the lowest numbers among the ASEAN-6 countries: Singapore [27], Malaysia [17], Thailand [15], Indonesia [15], Viet Nam [15]



Priority 9. Protect and Empower Consumers

- Establish more mechanisms that will empower consumers, including enhancing awareness of consumers' rights
- Ensure the availability of basic necessity & prime commodities (BNPCs)
 at reasonable prices by closely monitoring prices and negotiating with
 manufacturers/producers
- Keep track of price shifts from raw materials to finished products
- Conduct intensive review and verification process on granting requests for price adjustments
- Strengthen monitoring and enforcement on online businesses to safeguard product quality standards



Priority 10. Transform DTI into an Agile Organization

- Review the organizational structure in line with the President's directive for rightsizing
- Cut or lessen bureaucratic layers in decision-making as caused by a hierarchical structure
- Improve employees' expertise and skills in digital technology
- Engage and empower employees in their respective jobs
